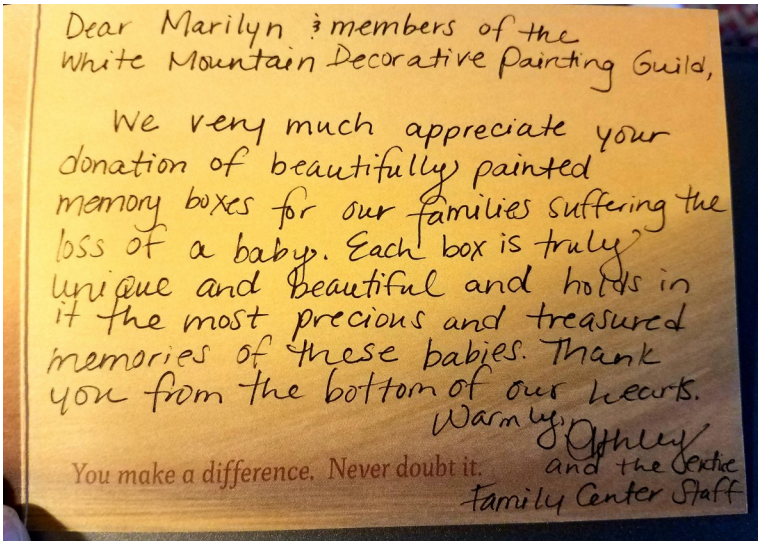

The following is a letter, edited for space, from a mother to someone who provided her with a painted Memory box when her first child did not survive due to a birth defect. We don't know the effects our boxes have on all recipients, but this is very touching – our efforts are very meaningful.

"Ten years ago, I received a Memory Box when I said goodbye to my first son. I had no idea what the box would come to mean to me. Over the years it slowly became my go-to place when I needed to remember.

The box has seen a lot in the last 10 years. It is no longer the perfectly painted masterpiece you once created. It is tattered and worn. There are bumps and blemishes where countless tears have been absorbed. Yet to me its beauty remains unmatched.

Today marks 10 years since my son was born. I opened the box again, read through the cards, and opened a small folded piece of paper that I hadn't seen before. It was a thoughtful poem and the names of the contributors. I needed to tell you thank you. Your gift was the one thing holding me together. It was the closest I would come to holding my child. Your kindness means more to me than I could ever express with words. Thank you for sending me hope when I had none. While it is not quite the beauty you once sent to me, that tattered box is my most treasured possession.

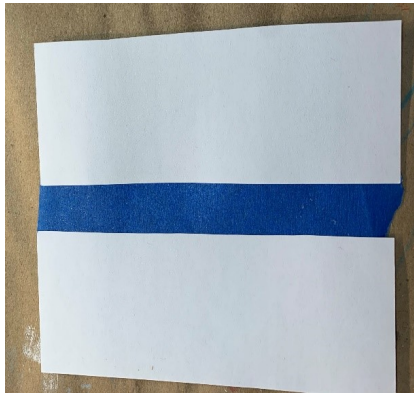




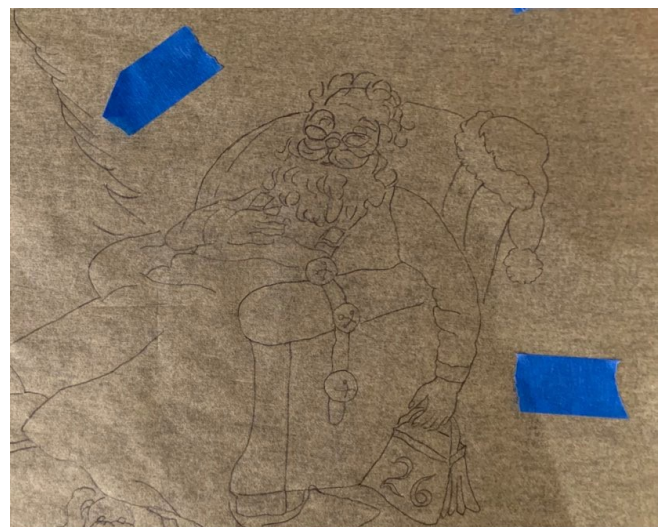
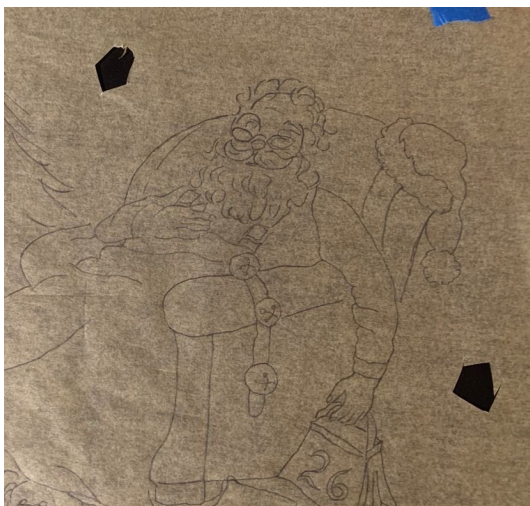
## *Tips ... Help Is On The Way!*

### Tip For Painting Small Objects from Janice Fusco

1. You will need heavy paper (I used a 4x6 index card), wide masking or blue tape and scissors
2. Cut paper in half length wise and put tape between cut halves.
3. Attach object to be painted to tape. Now you can paint little things without your fingers getting more paint on them than the thing being painted.



This is thinking outside the box! If you have a pattern that fits a surface but there's no extra surface space to tape it to, Make two holes in the pattern. Put your pattern in place and then tape down over the holes. NOTE: Blue Painters Tape is being used which is low tack and easily removed from patterns and surfaces. Another great tip from Janice Fusco.

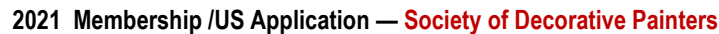
