



#### WMDPG General Meeting Minutes - Sunday, May 15, 2022

On May 15, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. White Mountain Decorative Painter's Guild held its first in-person meeting since March 2020, when Covid pandemic restrictions began. Fourteen attended on Zoom and 17 in person. Prior to the start of the meeting, held at the Bedford Country Inn and Suites, Bedford, NH and simultaneously on Zoom, attendees mingled over coffee and pastry, happily renewed acquaintances and admired the many Palette Potpourri projects on display. Janice Fusco then welcomed everyone and introduced each agenda item.

Susanna Duffy, Secretary, solicited corrections to the Minutes of the last General Meeting, published in "Tole it to the Mountains." No changes were requested and by motion made and seconded, the minutes were accepted.

Treasurer Janice Tomlin, attending virtually, recapped finances: checking account balance, \$24,500 the CD, \$7184. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Hard copies of the cash flow statement and 2022 budget were distributed. We don't have any figures yet from ArtRoom2Create, since it's a joint venture with Penn's Woods Chapter and data hasn't been compiled yet. The virtual retreat is now underway.

Newsletter Editor Sue Hodgkins spoke about our new website. It allows her to send three emails a month, bypassing MailChimp, a quota already met in May. Those emails concern the Random Acts of Kindness classes organized by Arlene Hilmer. Please sign up if you haven't already! The next two are Debbie Cushing's goldfinch on a branch and Liz Stull's Christmas mug (in three sizes) on June 16 and July 7, respectively. Suzi Franklin, Membership Secretary, reports we have 129 members.

Arlene Hilmer, Co Vice-President, spoke about two future workshops she has arranged for us: on August 20, a Ros Stallcup class and in November, a Debbie Cotton winter pickup truck scene. Suggestions are always welcome – contact either Arlene or Jacque.

Jacque Seastedt, Co Vice-President, described two SDP paint-ins we can participate in provided we find a teacher: a bunny and a Halloween design. Photos of these are on the SDP website. The bunny must be taught by June 30. **We need teachers to volunteer, please!** In September, Dotty Pullo, CDA will teach a dragonfly design. A member commented that SDP seems to be offering more to its members this year than in the past, such as monthly workshops and free patterns.

Janice Fusco reminded members, we need a Vice President for 2023. Please consider stepping up!

Leanne Kelley proceeded to scrutinize all in-person attendees for evidence of their name badges and subsequently to collect a one dollar penalty from non-compliant members. Leanne shows no mercy, as this Tole Gate money will be donated to David's House, a NH charity offering free accommodations for families of patients at Dartmouth Chlidren's Hospital.

Jacque also spoke about the Memory Box program She and her sister Marilyn Moses recently delivered some to Exeter Hospital. Undecorated boxes were available at the meeting for people to take home. More have been ordered. Some hospitals now prefer slightly larger boxes (deeper than 3 inches) to accommodate mementoes such as casts of babies' footprints. You can find boxes, which should be round, oval or heart-shaped only, on Amazon or in craft stores. Marilyn suggested that the inside be nicely finished (lined or painted) and the outside sealed.

Raffle Emcee Extraordinaire Leeanne Kelly conducted a raffle for those who submitted Palette Pot Pourri items. Marilyn Moses, Leona Magnarelli and Deanna Carter were winners. Later she hosted the Brown Bag silent auction, which netted \$50. Incentive prizes were awarded to purchasers of annual raffle tickets.

Reminders to all from Janice: Paulette DeGesare June 18 seminar is filling very quickly. The hotel in

Marlboro and NET classes are also filling up fast. WMDPG needs volunteers for 2-hour stints at Class Display. Please contact Larry Provencher or Janice Fusco to help. Volunteer hours earn money for the chapter.

#### **Old Business**

The payment of 50% of SDP dues on behalf of qualifying WMDPG members was explained. Details of this are in the last newsletter. Please send a check for \$45 to Suzi Franklin in payment of half your national dues and \$15 for 2023 WMDPG dues by July 31. Early payment will also earn you the perk of free patterns from SDP. This information will be emailed to members next month.

An Apprentice Treasurer is needed. Please consider stepping up.

#### **New Business**

The membership voted on two charitable donations: \$1,000 to David's House and \$300 to the Nashua, NH chapter of End 68 Hours of Hunger, which provides meals to food-insecure schoolchildren during weekends and summer vacation as a supplement to the free meals they receive on school days.

Suggestions from members included possibly instituting a tiered membership, different types of fundraisers, local painting classes for children.

It was noted that SDP is becoming a corporation. Members should read the new national bylaws to determine what effect, if any, this has on local chapters.

Carolyn Swasey and Janice Fusco will be attending the SDP Las Vegas convention in August, a great opportunity for them to network with potential instructors. The Chapter will reimburse each of them \$1,000 for expenses, double the amount spent in previous years because we spent nothing for this budget item in 2021.

The business meeting adjourned at 12:05 p.m. in time for Janice Fusco to teach her fabric painting workshop.

Carolyn Swasey and I attended The Society of Decorative Painters Cheers to 50 Years celebration in Las Vegas. There were familiar faces and new friends made. I was able to take classes with new to me teachers and to chat with teachers from classes gone by. Vendors sold their must have to all in attendance.

The highlight of my trip (and a check on my bucket list) was meeting and talking with the one and only Priscilla Hauser. She is a lovely lady who took the time to speak and take photos with anyone that approached her. Priscilla addressed the annual meeting, sharing the beginnings of SDP and her hopes for its future.

The Society of Decorative Painters Annual Meeting was held on August 9, 2022. The election of officers took place and Michelle Heiser was elected as President. Reports were presented and By Laws and Standing Rule changes were discussed and voted on. The common topic from those that spoke was a need to reduce costs and the biggest way to cut costs was the most unpopular subject of the meeting.

A proposed Standing Rule change was to keep annual dues at \$60.00/year and to make The Decorative Painter magazine completely virtual. The discussion that followed this proposed change was to say the least, heated. The bottom line is that SDP's financial situation is so dire that if the magazine is continued to be printed and mailed that it would be the end of SDP. An amendment was made, by our own Carolyn Swasey, to make annual dues \$50.00/year and the magazine be completely virtual. This amended Standing Rule was voted on and passed.

In short, beginning in 2023 our beloved Decorative Painter magazine will be entirely virtual. There will no longer be a printed magazine. The other piece of this new rule is the cost of dues. With our "Pay Half" program that we held earlier this summer there are questions that need to be answered. These questions will be addressed at our Board Meeting and reported back to our members at the next General Meeting in September.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to attend the 50<sup>th</sup> Celebration of SDP. It's always a joy to be among "our people", you know the ones, the ones that paint their clothes on purpose and buy just one more paint brush, bottle of paint, surface or pattern.

#### **Blueberry Coffee Cake**

½ c. butter

2 c. sugar

2 eggs, beaten

3 ½ c flour

½ teas. Baking soda

1 teas. cream of tartar

1 c. milk

1 ½ - 2 c. blueberries, fresh or frozen

½ c. blueberries for top of cake

2 tablespoons sugar

Cream butter well with 2 c. sugar sugar. Add 2 eggs and beat till combined.

Mix baking soda and cream of tartar into flour. Add alternately with milk. Continue to mix for a minute until combined but not too much.

Fold in  $1 \frac{1}{2} - 2 c$ . blueberries.

Spread batter into greased and floured 9x13 inch cake pan.

If desired, sprinkle extra ½ c. blueberries on top of cake, marbleize with knife. Sprinkle with 2 tablespoons sugar.

Bake at 350\* 50-60 minutes or until cake tests done and is lightly browned.

Different hospitals seem to request various sizes, depending on what they offer to send home with the grieving parents who have lost a new baby. We will be delivering boxes to Portsmouth Hospital this week. We give round, square, oval and heart shaped paper mache boxes of sizes 5 up to size 9 inches. Size 7"-8" would be the ones we could use mostly at this time. We would appreciate it if you could finish the inside of the box by painting it or lining it with fabric. Applying felt or Soft Flock to the bottom is attractive also. Varnishing over the paint will help protect the box and its contents. Thank you very much for your continued donations. Your talents are greatly appreciated by many parents.

The email service also works with email providers to guarantee we aren't spamming and so our newsletter emails do not end up in your junk file.

To click on the link or any link, move your mouse to that word or sentence and do a left click. If you aren't using a mouse but a cell phone, tablet, or iPad, tap on the word or sentence with your finger.

If you lose a newsletter you can find the current and past newsletters posted on our website www.wmdpgnh.org . The newsletter is posted on the website soon after it is emailed.

#### Join our Facebook Page!

We also announce on our Facebook page when the newsletter has been emailed. Printed newsletters go to the post office within a day or two of the email.

Our Facebook page is also a good way to see reminders and sometimes some tips that are shared from other websites.

#### Watercolor Painting in France - Donna Frost

My long awaited dream to visit France finally happened when I signed up for a trip to Fraysinnet with Fran Mittelstet and Carol Spohn for ten days at Le Vieux Couvent. This is an artists retreat in an ancient stone building where we had private rooms. Most meals were included. Most mornings were spent exploring the rural country-side, visiting ancient towns and having a picnic lunch buffet before returning to Le Vieux Couvent for afternoon watercolor lessons.

Fran and Carol took turns teaching simple projects. There were 11 painters in the group and some skill levels were very basic. Carol worked on inspiring us to do a journal. My favorite project required some skill. We chose a photograph and cut away part of it then painted the part we had cut away. I think this was my best project. See the photo.

We had been given a supply list of paints, brushes, etc. to bring but like any seminar everyone shared. I did not bring Arches watercolor paper which the teachers insisted we use so I was given paper to use. If you fold a sheet in half with a good crease you can hold the V shaped paper end down to the table then exert some pressure beginning at the bottom and it will tear along the crease. Just keep exerting pressure on the crease until it tears completely in half.

Although I brought a board, Carol showed a plasticized sign she got at a craft store which she cut in half and then taped both sides together to use as a portfolio. One half made a good light weight work surface. Wet both sides of Arches paper and it will stick to the plasticized board without the need to use painters tape. A wide hake brush was preferred for wetting paper since the soft bristles don't damage the wet paper.

Possibly our most fascinating visit was to a cave to see prehistoric cave drawings. This was the inspiration for another project. I liked a friend's finished work better. Carol had line drawings of the cave animals to use but the great tip was to use a black watercolor crayon to draw the animals. The crayon against rough paper did a good simulation of the cave drawing and just needed a little water.

Cotton gauze was pulled apart into four separate layers then cut and stretched and pressed on the watercolored background to simulate fissures in the cave wall. Take a paintbrush loaded with color, touch it to the gauze and let it travel the threads.

We used Mafa paper for another project. We traced a poppy design on the shiny side, crinkled it twice and then swiped watered down India ink along the crinkled surface, just hitting the high spots, to make a batiked background.

One of the easiest projects was to use ¼ tape to tape off a fence. The sky was washed with blue and then clouds were lifted off with a crumpled piece of Kleenex. Then we painted a flower garden and grass, removed the tape to paint fence details and also to paint some flowers like branches of roses over the fence. There were all kinds of roses everywhere we looked.


Fran brought a Huion Light Box maybe 14 x 18" that retails for around \$38.00. It is an A4 Light Pad which can be recharged with a usb cable. This is very thin like an iPad and perfect for tracing. Excess graphite should be removed by gently rubbing the surface with a kneaded eraser.

The studio was open all the time but I was not as industrious as some. The trip was a good mix of sightseeing, painting and eating. With only a total of 16 people we had two vans with English speaking drivers to take us around including an unscheduled visit to a pharmacy for decongestant tablets. Another painter tried to pet the vicious Siamese despite being warned not to so she also had to visit a doctor and go on antibiotics. The retreat manager took care of everything and at the end of our visit had a private nurse come to do covid tests. Fifty percent of people in this southern area of France are British ex-pats so many people spoke English. Many shopkeepers also spoke English unlike in Paris where many only spoke French.

Several years ago I went on a similar trip to the Amalfi Coast of Italy to do plein aire painting with Lina Ferrara. I did less painting there because we spent the day in different towns where I preferred to explore rather than paint.

Thanks to SDP and NET conventions I met teachers who offer painting vacations to Europe. The small group size is ideal plus I enjoyed the freedom to explore each town. Best wishes to Anne Wifholm who is going on Fran's trip to Tuscany this fall.
