Tips ... Help Is On The Way!

Trick #1: We've all put a pencil mark on a wall for hanging a new work of art and gotten the mark in the wrong place (my husband always hangs things too high). The solution? Place painter's tape on the wall and put the pencil mark on the tape! If you got it right, hammer in the hanger. If you got it wrong, remeasure, move the tape and there is no unsightly pencil mark on your wall that never comes off without marring the surface.

Trick #2: I had to have some window roller shades cut to size and while watching the machine do it's thing inspiration struck. The cut piece of the shade fell on the floor, I picked it up and thought this would be great to lay on my table while base coating. Roll out a length of material do your painting then either cut the used portion off or roll it up to use another time. Other things to consider: ∞The shades I needed were quite narrow so there was about 12 inches cut off and I bought the cheapest shade they had, (about \$8.50 each). ∞ You could buy a wider shade and have it cut to fit your table or just cut in half. ∞Ask if you can check the waste bucket on the cutting machine to recycle the scrap pieces that are just going to be thrown away. ∞Goodwill, thrift stores, yard sales are a great place to find used roller shades.

With permission from Bobbie Campbell I'm sharing her "dot" tip: To prevent pointed dots - add a little water to your paint before dotting. The water will allow the paint to flatten after the dot is made. Make sure to do some practice dots to determine the amount of water needed.

(and Melanie Knox showed me how to put glob of paint on my other thumb nail so the paint is close and handy for dipping my stylus.)

When preparing to put a pattern on a surface for watercolor or colored pencil, place your surface paper in your printer. Put 2 pieces of cheap tracing paper on the copy surface (platten) of your printer and place your pattern to be transferred on top of that, face down. When copied, the resulting copy will be light enough that it will not show under the WC or CP you apply. This is easy to erase too. If there are elements of the design that you do not wish to transfer, simply use white-out to cover them before copying. ... from Suzi Franklin






