Book Review and Brush Tip

North Light Books

Although this is not new, it can be bought on Amazon, North Light Books, Thrift Books or can be found sometimes in thrift shops or used book sales. Your local library may have a copy too.

When we spoke about reviewing techniques, Strokework was one of the things that came to mind. In this book, Maureen provides instructions for lots of different types of strokes and also shows pictures of stroke errors and how to prevent those! Even those of us who are pretty capable, sometimes have a type of stroke that causes us problems or an off day where our strokes are not correct. This book is a great guide for us or a gift for a new painter.

Now for the prize! Not only does it have all of that, it also has some beautiful additional Maureen patterns included in the book as well as instructions on how to set up a wet palette without having to go out and buy one!

Also...Of course you know we all need **MORE BRUSHES!** If you are looking for reasonably priced brushes to replace some of the worn out brushes, try ZEN brushes.

Prices range from about \$3 to \$7 each and most types can be found at Michael's and other stores that contain art supplies. They are made by Royal Langnickel.

Try one. I think you'll like them!

Keep in Touch



May 3rd - Afternoon project - Sue Hodgkins “Cardinal Barn Quilt”

Learn how to work with gridlines to create any barn quilt. The cardinal is a good one to start on because it uses a simple 5 block grid as shown in the picture below. Opposite is a picture of one that I finished. More directions will be coming in the next newsletter but you can be keeping an eye out for a surface in the meantime. I cut my own wood using 1/2 inch plywood but you can find nice precut wood blanks or frames in varying sizes. I am unsure of the size of the one below because I have made them in so many different sizes. If you note the gridlines below, you will see 5 blocks across and 5 blocks down. I also have a 1/2 inch border around. To make things easier on yourself, for this first one, you should try to find a square that is divisible by 5 plus one inch. In other words, 10 inch plus 1=11 in., 15 inch plus one=16in. etc. If you can't find the perfect size, the border can always be enlarged to accommodate.


