

WMDPG General Meeting Minutes - Sunday, March 12, 2023

A business meeting of the White Mountain Decorative Painters Guild was held on March 12, 2023 at the Londonderry Senior Center in Londonderry, New Hampshire in person and on Zoom. The meeting began at 10:05. There were 20 in person members present.

President Jacque Seastedt opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance, following which the group congratulated beloved and longtime member Shirley Cochis on her 90th birthday. Jacque thanked Linda Conners for providing us a wonderful mac and cheese lunch. Leanne Kelley inspected members to check for name tags and extorted a one dollar fine from violators.

Carolyn Swasey presented dates for workshops during the remainder of 2023. All events are posted on ArtRoom2Create. A few notable ones are: Paulette DeGesare on March 18, Lise Lorentzen on April 22, Maureen Baker on May 6 (\$20 price includes kit), Nancy Scott Random Acts of Kindness ("RAK") class on April 10 (use coupon code SCOTT to qualify for free class). A more complete listing appears in the most recent newsletter.

We have received a thank you for our David's House donation.

Sue Black has successfully arranged for three more RAK classes via Zoom: a floral box on June 10 with Linda O'Connell; an altered art design using vintage papers such as sheet music with Lori Webber on July 24; and an Erika Joanne class (taught with permission by another person). Carolyn reminded all present that if you take one of the free RAK classes, you agree to donate the completed memory box to either White Mountain or your local group. You are free to paint another for yourself, of course.

Sue Duffy, Secretary, asked for comments on the previous meeting minutes as published in "Tole it to the Mountains." As there were no changes, the minutes were accepted by motion made and seconded. She stated St. Patrick's Day theme table decorations would be given to whichever members drew a "lucky 7" card bearing an Irish maxim.

Betty Vitale, our Treasurer, reported previous balances of \$18,000 and \$7800 in our checking and CD accounts, respectively. She has now acquired a debit card and closed out the CD, depositing the funds in checking until we find a bank with a higher interest rate. We will then add enough funds to the CD to round it up to \$10,000. This transfer brings the current checking balance up to \$26,300. These financial matters were discussed and voted on at the last Board meeting. Janice Fusco moved to accept Betty's report, the motion was seconded by Mary Frambach and the report was accepted by majority vote.

Membership Chair Suzi Franklin announced a total membership of 166. Kris Lafayette did a 40-call telephone marathon to recruit member renewals and was able to get five renewals. Kris acknowledged Sue Black's help with this endeavor.

Editor Sue Hodgkins has updated some of our newsletter practices. We now get requests for publicity from other guilds, which she publishes if the date is earlier than our deadline. However, she isn't able to send an email blast for just one single seminar on behalf of another guild. Because of prior problems with MailChimp, we're considering using a service called "Constant Contact" to distribute the newsletter. It offers unlimited emails at a reasonable price. If you think you've missed a newsletter, always check by clicking the "newsletter" tab on the WMDPGNH.org website.

Donning her IT hat, Sue then reported the new speakers used for the meeting are working well today. Sue then slipped into her black barrister's robe and white wig before updating us of her progress working on White Mountain's legal status with the help of both Dorey Joy (Berkshire Brushes) and an attorney from Concord, NH, who isn't charging for advice. Our Articles of Agreement will be amended and submitted to the State of New Hampshire

Marilyn Moses spoke about our Memory Box donation program and displayed some beautifully painted examples, seven of which were donated by Linda Conners. For details of this program, please see the article on page 8 of this newsletter.

Leanne Kelley announced incentive prizes for annual raffle ticket holders would be awarded at meeting's end. She spoke about her role as Hospitality Chair, sending electronic get-well, birthday and other appropriate cards to members on behalf of White Mountain. Please let her know if you're aware of someone we should remember. Since some of the emails have bounced back to her, Suzi Franklin will work with Leanne to check for updated addresses.

Raffle incentive prizes included a canvas flag for March, four unpainted placemats, and a very large wooden tray that will be painted as a prize. Shirley Cochis volunteered to paint a wooden paddle. These projects should be completed and given back to Leanne by this summer.

Mary Frambach, White Mountain's 2023 NEDA rep (formerly NECC) reported she expects to have an update in May. There are now photo previews of 2023 NET classes posted on line.

Jacque mentioned the Goldfinch guild will sponsor a live Lynne Andrews class on April 12 in New Jersey. <u>Khansen@hotmail.com</u> (Karen Hansen) is the contact person.

Cindy Harrison's planned sale of surfaces has been rescheduled to May.

WMDPG General Meeting Minutes - (cont.)

Palette Pourri contributors were Shirley Cochis, Anne Wifholm, Deb Courville, Kris Lafayette, Janice Fusco, Sandra Phillips, Garnett Joy and Larry Provencher.

The Board has voted to eliminate centerpieces at meetings unless someone volunteers to provide them on occasion. Jacque will bring a bowl of candy for each table in May, and others are free to follow suit for future meetings. We usually set up ten tables.

Displaying a large framed painting, Kris Lafayette explained it is a scaled-down reproduction of a beautiful hand-painted mural at the Veterans Administration Hospital Manchester, New Hampshire. In 1994 White Mountain Decorative Painters pooled their talents by painting portions of the original mural, which is a panorama of US Military history depicting war song sheet music, military battle scenes, and famous generals from the Civil War to Desert Storm. Six panels were created. They have now been restored and were rededicated in 2004. You can view a photo on our website or see the mural itself in the hallway off the main entrance of the VA Hospital.

Following her remarks, Kris presented the framed painting to our esteemed member Shirley Cochis on behalf of White Mountain Painters to honor not only her milestone birthday, but her many years of spirited dedication to and support of the guild. Shirley, we love you!

At the conclusion of the meeting, Jacque Seastedt mentioned her email had been hacked by a scammer requesting gift cards for veterans. Beware of any similar emails.

Janice Fusco won the Palette Potpourri drawing. She had displayed two beautiful round wooden plates decorated entirely in dots and has offered to give the guild a class in this technique.

Jacque then moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and accepted, with the meeting adjourning at 11:20. Following a lunch break, Dotty Pullo, CDA presented her original columbine and daisy springtime painting class.

Memory Box Program

We received a delivery of several memory boxes at the March meeting. The photo shows several sizes, shapes and designs, all beautifully painted. The creativity of our members is exceptional! The birthing center at St. Joseph's Hospital in Nashua was the latest recipient of memory boxes from our guild. They, like many hospitals, now offer small molds of the deceased infant's hand or foot. The 7-8" sized boxes seem perfect for saving this mold, plus other items like a identification bracelet, a tiny hat or blanket. Some parents save smaller items so a 6 box is sometimes chosen. We like to have the inside of the box painted and the box varnished as parents keep it for many years as a remembrance of their baby. It is nice to sign your painting also. Please choose a round, oval, square or heart shaped box and not a rectangle one as it does resemble a coffin.

If you do not live near our guild you can paint a box and deliver it to a hospital in your area. Please take a photo of the box and tell us where it was delivered. We would love to see it. It can be mailed to us if you wish. Email Marilyn at <u>esmjmoses@comcast.net</u> for an address to send a box to us. You can also bring them to New England Traditions Convention which will be held in Marlborough, Massachusetts on October 3-8. Just ask for Jacque or Marilyn and we can meet to collect your box.

There are exciting Memory Box classes scheduled during the coming months. The classes and patterns are offered by artists and free to us. We will all look forward to seeing these new designs. Check our newsletters for further information. Thank you for your continuing offerings of painted boxes.

Because we are selling things like raffle tickets and seminars, we have to use a service that provides an "opt out" (unsubscribe) that a member can use so we are not guilty of spamming. To click on the link or any link, move your mouse to that word or sentence and do a left click. If you aren't using a mouse but a cell phone, tablet, or iPad, tap on the word or sentence with your finger.










NET News


On April 1st, the catalog will be available on the website (<u>NewEnglandTraditions.org</u>) You

All designs and Zoom classes are free to us paint with the expectation that a box will be donated to the Memory Box Program or donated to a hospital near you. Boxes can also be brought to NET.

The May 7th, program after our general meeting, is with Chris Watson. She designed this project just for us. Who doesn't like painting flowers and learning new techniques? She has painted this design on a canvas tote and will be using DecoArt Acrylic paints with Textile Medium. 




